



deed, do everything in the thanks to God the Father through Him."

-Colossians 3:17

This passage, written by the apostle Paul to the church in Colossae, was meant to be an encouragement to early believers in Jesus who at


times were becoming easily swayed by the arguments and words of others that taught things contrary to what Paul and his followers were proclaiming. The community was made up of primarily Gentile believers in an urban center that at one time commanded great respect and influence. As a crossroads of commerce, they were adept at understanding different cultures and integrating them into their own community. What they struggled with was consistency in their own lives as they traversed this new journey of faith they now proclaimed.

I've always been drawn to the verse above in terms of how I understand stewardship. I don't simply mean our financial stewardship, but rather how we utilize our talents, our relationships, our experiences, and our determination for the glory of God. The "desire to be better tomorrow than we are today" (in every facet of our lives) is another way of stating this. The trouble is, life isn't predictable or consistent.

Whatever you do in word or I was reminded of this recently while golfing with my son and a few men from church. Golf is a name of the Lord Jesus, giving funny game, chasing a little white ball around a manicured lawn, beating it mercilessly towards a hole that requires gentle touch in order to sink the putt! I have a sign in my office that says, "When ancient man screamed and beat the ground with sticks, they called it witchcraft. Today, we call if golf!" The way I've hit the ball recently, I think there might be a bit more to the witchcraft argument! But in talking with my son later, he reflected on the good shots he hit. He didn't focus on the times the ball went the wrong direction, or the multiple strokes it took many of us to finish a hole. Rather, he recalled those few well hit and pure shots. That's the magic of golf...those few good shots will bring you back to try and replicate that moment over and over again.

To be successful at golf, or any endeavor for that matter, requires consistency. Consistency is the result of practice. And effective practice is the result of good instruction. Paul understood this. We understand it today. Nevertheless, it is so easy to get distracted and have our focus redirected.

A good friend and avid golfer once gave me a card that reminded me "the golf course of life doesn't steer us from the hazards and traps of life, but carries us through them." God knew we would continue to find ourselves in difficult situations... and He promised to be with us each step of the way. So, whatever you do, in word or deed, do it in the name of the Lord...and give thanks always! Pastor Todd




