1/168 It's Not Enough! D6: A MOVEMENT, NOT MERELY A CURRICULUM

Has a title or a saying ever jumped out at you? I know when I was a kid I begged my mom for a box of Wheaties. It is the "breakfast of champions!" I look back and it wasn't so much the bowl of Wheaties I ate but it was my mom always talking with me while I ate my "breakfast of champions." Honestly, I was not as good at that with our daughters. They had breakfast but I did not always talk with them. I let them watch cartoons so I could get things ready for the day. Now, they are 21 and 23 and I regret not talking with them at each breakfast. I see clearer now that time is impact!

How do we make the time for impact with people in the fast-paced culture of the 21st century? "1/168 It's Not Enough!" is a driver of D6 generational discipleship. "1/168" is a flawed fraction that represents the 1 hour out of 168 hours in a week spent at church. FUMC is intentionally moving towards a culture where the church partners with homes for a lasting generational change. The goal is to marginally increase the parent's role in reinforcing faith learning and discipleship at home. December can be a hectic month. Celebrating Advent 2017

The season of **Advent**, which comes from the Latin word "adventus" meaning "coming" or "visit," begins four Sundays (December 3) before Christmas and ends on Christmas Eve. **Advent is the beginning of the liturgical year for Christians.**

Although we are accustomed to celebrating Christmas on a single day, in both Christian tradition and on the Church calendar, the **Christmas season** lasts sundown on December 24 (Christmas Eve) through Epiphany of the Lord (January 6). This is sometimes popularly referred to as "the twelve days of Christmas."

The Advent wreath, four candles on a wreath of evergreen, is shaped in a perfect circle to symbolize the eternity of God. In our worship services, we light three purple, and one candle being rose or pink, to represent joy. The one larger white candle in the middle is the Christ candle.

For each Sunday of Advent, we focus on one of the four virtues Jesus brings us: Hope, Love, Joy and Peace. The white, center candle, the Christ candle, is lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day to remind Christians that Jesus is the light of the world. The order and exact wording vary among churches, but the wreath continually reminds us of whom we are called to be as followers of Jesus. — United Methodist Church, www.umc.org.
