ith great anticipation, be on the lookout for an email survey from FUMC's Family Ministry team: Family Ministries Pastor Karin Carlson, Youth Pastor Caleb Eckels, and Children's Pastor April Cole. FUMC wants to partner with parents to help raise your families in the Christian faith.

Luke 2:40-52 is the basis for the overall plan. That's the scripture detailing Jesus's childhood. The Family Ministry team's prayer is to create the same scriptural environments for your family to grow into deeply devoted followers of Jesus.



The January meeting of the Church Council focused on prayer. Staff-Parish Relations Committee chair, Cindy Fowler, reported on a recent meeting with District Superintendent Rev. Dr. Eddie Rivera. She said that Rev. Rivera asked SPRC to be in 'a season of

prayer' as we seek the pastor who will succeed Rev. Terry Tamplen. Prayer cards were distributed in which the desired characteristics are listed for our new pastoral leader:

- Strong Leadership
- Great Preaching
- Heart for Evangelism/Visionary Growth Orientation
- Spiritual Depth
- Biblical Teaching

The characteristics are a compilation of traits that members of the SPRC believe to be important for our congregation. The cards are to be a prayer guide during the time the New Mexico Conference and North Texas Conference Appointive Cabinets begin to meet in March.

Pastor Terry encouraged the council to read a book by Rev. Jim Griffin, *The Changeover Zone*, Successful Pastoral Transitions. The title refers to the space on a track where relay runners pass the baton from one runner to another. It's an important space and timing procedure to ensure the baton isn't dropped. Terry believes it is an appropriate reading for the transition time our church is facing. Rev. Griffin has been the 'coach' for our church and Pastor Donnie Williams during the creation of The Bridge, our satellite campus.


