Musical Christmas Celebrations in Each Service December 15

9a.m. Service, the Sanctuary Choir sings Have You Heard. It's Christmas with a Celtic kick! A Celtic Christmas Celebration by Joel Raney. Have You Heard is brimming with beloved tunes like "I Saw Three Ships," "Gentle Mary Laid Her Child," "Away in the Manger," and others associated with the British Isles like "Loch Lomond" and Londonderry Air.

11a.m. Service, the Praise Band performs musical selections from Kemper Crabb. Kemper Crabb is a modern man, artist, and visionary steeped in historical Christianity. He preaches a Gospel of artistic truth and biblical foundations that draws men and women into his music, writings, and teachings. BLUE CHRISTMAS SERVICE Thursday, Dec. 19 6:30 p.m. Chapel

This special worship service is a time to acknowledge to ourselves and others that at Christmas time there is sadness, sorrow, pain and grief in our lives that needs to be honored. It is the prayer of those organizing this worship service that in the aftermath of the August 31 shootings that claimed the lives of seven people, this service bring comfort to all of Odessa.

The candles of this candle light service serve as petitions to God for loved ones who are not with us this holiday season.

Celebrating Advent 2019

The season of **Advent**, which comes from the Latin word "adventus" meaning "coming" or "visit," begins four Sundays (December 1) before Christmas and ends on Christmas Eve. **Advent is the beginning of the liturgical year for Christians.**

Although we are accustomed to celebrating Christmas on a single day, in both Christian tradition and on the Church calendar, the Christmas season lasts sundown on December 24 (Christmas Eve) through Epiphany of the Lord (January 6). This is sometimes popularly referred to as "the twelve days of Christmas."

The **Advent wreath**, four candles on a wreath of evergreen, is shaped in a perfect circle to symbolize the eternity of God. In our worship services, we light three purple, and one candle being rose or pink, to represent joy. The one larger white candle in the middle is the Christ candle.

For each Sunday of Advent, we focus on one of the four virtues Jesus brings us: Hope, Love, Joy and Peace. The white, center candle, the Christ candle, is lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day to remind Christians that Jesus is the light of the world. The order and exact wording vary among churches, but the wreath continually reminds us of whom we are called to be as followers of Jesus. — United Methodist Church, www.umc.org.
