The new intergenerational women's ministry, **The Well**, has successfully tapped into an intergenerational yearning of answering the deep cry of one's heart. About 65 women are participating in the six-week study, *Finding I Am*. The seven *I Am* statements of Jesus are found in the Gospel of John. *I Am* the bread of Life. *I Am* the light of the world. *I Am* the door. *I Am* the Good Shepard. *I Am* the resurrection and the life. *I Am* the way and the truth of life. *I Am* the vine. The spiritually and intellectually stimulating gatherings are a combination of daily "home work"

lessons, a video lecture by author Lysa TerKeurst, table discussions of probing questions followed by a group wrap-up session. To accommodate all busy schedules all the while maintaining social distancing, the study is offered on Monday mornings at 10:00 a.m. and Wednesday evenings at 5:00 p.m. There will be a final celebration of both groups on November 4.

The Well women's ministry began last month when a group of young mothers decided to tap into the yearnings of their hearts to become more involved with all generations of women here at our church. These women have been active in our D6 Curriculum which emphasizes all generations learning from each other.


